Appendix M – Operational Specifications, Scope of Work paragraph numbering will be corrected to read paragraphs 1 - 6:

1. The Contractor will follow the Regional District's direction in regards to the area of the Landfill that will be used for the disposal and compaction of deposited waste materials. The Contractor will undertake the relocation of any deposited waste material, as directed by the Regional District.
2. The Contractor will provide and operate one track-type bulldozer in good working order with an operating weight of not less than 15,876 kilograms, equipped with standard or narrow tracks exerting a ground weight not less than 0.41 kg/cm² and an operating grouser depth of not less than 5 cm. The bulldozer will be equipped with a push blade and compaction track shoes or teeth, with grouser bars as described. Maximum age for this equipment must not exceed 15 years.
3. The contractor will provide and operate one tandem axle dump truck in good working order to facilitate the transporting of a minimum of 6 cubic meters of cover material to the active face. Maximum age for this equipment must not exceed 15 years.
4. The contractor will provide and operate one excavator in good working order to facilitate the excavation of cover material in the burrow pit area, in accordance with the *BC mines act*, Maximum age of this equipment must not exceed 15 years.
5. **The Contractor will spread deposited waste materials in layers of 0.6 metres or less and then compact the 0.6 metre layer of waste material with at least three to five passes of the bulldozer. After the spread layer of deposited waste material has been compacted, an additional layer of 0.6 metres of deposited waste material can be spread over the previously compacted waste materials and compacted with at least three to five passes of the bulldozer. This process is to be repeated until all of the deposited waste material has been compacted in the identified working area.**
6. **The Contractor will then apply a soil cover over the compacted material. The depth of compacted soil cover is to be 0.15 metres. Care will be taken to cover all areas of exposed waste material including the active fill area and edges (toe). The slope of the working edge of the active fill area and any finished edges will not exceed 3:1 (horizontal : vertical) after compaction unless directed otherwise by the Regional District.**

PART B – INSTRUCTIONS TO TENDERERS, MANDATORY SITE MEETING, 4th paragraph

Currently reads:

The mandatory site visit will be held at the Mackenzie Landfill on April 21, 2026, at 11:00 a.m.

Shall be changed to read:

The mandatory site visit will be held at the Mackenzie Landfill on April 21, 2026, at **11:30 a.m.**

PART B – INSTRUCTIONS TO TENDERERS, TENDER PROCESS, “Section 10. Bonding”, is no longer required in this Invitation to Tender package.

Any references to a bid bond within this Invitation to Tender document are no longer in effect.

Question 1: The tender states spreading waste in layers, is there enough room to do that for the first service.

Answer: As per the site meeting, Appendix M – Operational Specifications, Scope of Work, paragraph 5 is unattainable for the first service, compaction in place is acceptable.

Question 2: Will low bed costs be covered?

Answer: Only if they are included in the successful bid schedule of pricing.

Question 3: On the cover page it states a mandatory site meeting on April 21 2026 at 11:30 am but on page 6 it says that there is a mandatory site meeting on April 21 2026 at 11:00 am. What time will this meeting be taking place?

Answer: There was a typo on Page 5. The Mandatory Site Meeting took place at 11:30 am on April 21, 2026.

Question 4: On page 10 item 10.1 it states that a bid bond is required. As the schedule of pricing calls for a hourly rate under assumptions of hours and quantities, what amount are we actual basing this bond on?

Answer: A bid bond will not be required for this contract. Please see above.

Question 5: As the only pricing is based on an hourly charge with no perceived actual amount of work each time it is difficult to incorporate a mobilization cost into this. Would the district entertain a separate line item for mobilization?

Answer: See above change and attached Appendix D for tender submittal.

Question 6: On page 39 under item 3 of the scope of work, it specifies the use of a tandem axle dump truck. Can the contractor use an off road rock truck and or a tri-axle dump truck?

Answer: Yes. The tandem axel dump truck represents the minimum requirement.

Question 7: On page 40 the hours of operation state that the gate is only open for 8 hours Monday to Friday and 6 hours on the weekends. Is the contractor held to these hours, or would there be separate access for contractor to work longer hours than gate open hours?

Answer: Contractor must work during site operational hours. Changes to operating hours may apply if the manager approves the need and or circumstances.
